## Monday Fall 2024 Classes

#### Charlotte Mason, Mrs. Harris (ages 4-8)

Spend an hour with friends in a Charlotte Mason way. Afternoons will contain good stories, art studies, handicrafts, old-fashioned games, and free play.

## Spanish, Mrs. Law (ages 5-9)

This introduction to the Spanish language requires no prior experience. Class time will be spent learning stories, songs, scripture, and poetry in Spanish. Lessons will also include nature study, Gouin series, and some basic greetings and vocabulary taught via the direct method. The course will be a fun and light-hearted experience that will motivate students intended to encourage students to continue to study Spanish in the future.

## Collage Art, Miss Peck (ages 6-10).

I'm looking forward to sharing my Collage Art & Painting lessons. Using images, color and words, students will discover their meanings and explore the joy of creating beautiful, colorful, expressive art. By using our creative expression mixed with Modge Podge, paint, cutting paper, & our own photos, we will share stories of creation, our own lives, dreams we have, activities we enjoy, people we love & messages to give us hope.

#### Photography (ages 8-12), Mrs. Pica

Using the Masterbooks curriculum for Digital Photography, students will grow to understand photography as a means of personal expression, worship, and service to the kingdom of God. Through this course, appropriate for all ages who can operate a cell phone or tablet camera independently, students will learn the technical requirements of good photography such as focus, exposure, perspective, framing, and composition. *Students must provide a digital device that can take a picture.* 

Exploring Presidential Leadership: What would you do? Mrs. Embry (Ages 10 and up) Journey through American history through the lens of presidential leadership. From the Founding Fathers to modern-day leaders, explore pivotal moments, decisions, and their enduring impact. Students will engage in lively debates, analyze challenges faced, and explore the complexities of leadership. They'll gain insights into the weighty responsibilities of the presidency, fostering a deeper appreciation for its enduring significance while honing debating skills in a team format.

Intermediate Band, Mrs. Catron (students from Beginning Band with Mrs. Catron or with other experience). This course is open to students who have mastered the beginning level of band. Students entering this course should be proficient in music reading, tone production, blending and balancing, dynamics and rehearsal procedures. All techniques from the Beginning Band course will be further developed in Intermediate Band. At this level there is a greater emphasis placed on performance. Students will also begin learning more scales and other rudiments. Private lessons are encouraged but not required for Intermediate Band students. This course requires students to have a musical instrument (e.g., borrow, rent, purchase). Students will also need to have a wire music stand and may need to purchase the Essential Elements Band Book 2.



## Wednesday Fall 2024 Courses

#### Sign, Sign, and Dance, Mrs. Bortone (ages 5-12)

We will learn Psalms with melodies and ASL, warm up with ballet barre exercises, then add dance to the Psalms. Supplies needed: ballet shoes or old socks. Please pull long hair back into a ponytail or bun. I praise you for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Your works are wonderful, I know that full well! Psalm 139:14

## STEM in cooking, Mrs. Corpening (ages 5-8)

Discover some of the Science, Engineering, and Math behind kid-favorite foods. We will hypothesize, observe, measure, explore chemical reactions and simple cooking techniques, and hopefully have something tasty to show for it each week. Students will have opportunities to participate in a basic Scientific Method, practice Lab Safety and Kitchen Hygiene, and expand their palates! (This class will be in accordance with Deerstream Policies regarding food allergies.)

## Field Games, Mrs. Winslow (ages 5-10)

Who's ready to play? This class is for any kid interested in fun, active, playful field games. We will run, jump, freeze, spin, throw, hop, and get our wiggles out while enjoying the great outdoors. These cooperative field games will keep your child moving, encourage fair play, cooperation, and accepting defeat graciously, and work on improving skills, with a side of silly fun in a friendly environment.

#### Beginning Scratch, Mr. Arnold (8 and up)

Learn the basics of coding through fun, game-building exercises using the Scratch platform. Children will make their own colorful, fun games and animations that can be played anywhere all while learning the basics of computer logic and coding. A laptop or iPad with keyboard is recommended for this class, but laptops will be provided for those who need them.

#### Deerstream Theatrical Society, Mrs. Harris (ages 10 and up)

Learn about Shakespeare and delve into one of his works! After some teacher-led instruction about a play by the Bard, students will take the lead in preparing a performance of an adapted script. Students will design costumes, create props, practice their roles, and present their Shakespeare production to an adoring audience.

**Drawing, Miss Peck (ages 10 and up)** This Art Course offers instruction and practice using various mediums for sketching and drawing using lead pencil, black ink, charcoal, and some color, too. The students will have the opportunity to practice realism with the focus being Still Life. We'll also have some time for our creative expression to play on the pages telling "our stories" through art. Looking forward to another semester with your Deerstream students.



#### Thursday Fall 2024 Classes

## Illustrated Writing, Mrs. Pica (ages 5-8)

Illustrated Writing: Using Draw Write Now curriculum along with Fix It Grammar, beginner writers will learn the basics of writing disguised in the fun of drawing! This class will be enjoyable for early elementary level as well as slightly older writers who need extra writing practice. It's a unique combination of art, fine motor skills, interesting topics, writing, and fun!

## History and Chemistry, Mrs. Bortone (7-12)

Soap, clothing dyes, oxidation and carbonation all involve chemistry. We will learn about the chemists behind these discoveries and more (Galen, Joseph Priestly, Antoine Lavoisier, Dimitri Mendeleev) as we change states of matter and make models of chemical structures.

## Beginning Band, Mrs. Catron (ages 8 and up).

This course is designed for students with little or no instrumental experience. Instrumentalists will focus on note reading, introductory music theory, fundamental music terminology, sound production, instrument care and maintenance, and individual/group rehearsal strategies. A public performance following the 11-week course will serve as a culmination of specific instructional goals. This course requires students to obtain a musical instrument (e.g., borrow, rent, purchase). Students will also need to have a wire music stand and purchase the assigned band book. #### Intermediate Scratch, Mr. Arnold (ages 9 and up)

For those who are more familiar with Scratch or who have already been through the intro course and feel like they're ready for the next step, this class will introduce some more complex ideas such as cloud based high scoring systems and more advanced levels and game design while retaining the fun and easy pace of the introduction class. A laptop or iPad with keyboard is recommended for this class, but laptops will be provided for those who need them.

## Mythology, Mrs. Eriksen (ages 9 and up, willingness to read necessary)

Do you love reading stories, myths, and legends? Do you love studying ancient history? Do you love creative writing? Then this course is the perfect mix for you! We will focus on exploring the myths and folk- lore of different ancient cultures from around the world - Greek, Roman, Norse, Mayan, Aztec, Egyptian, African, Chinese and Japanese. We will study stories of the gods and heroes and analyze the values and beliefs those stories convey. Students will have a chance to read and hear new and familiar myths, create their own using similar styles, and explore the myths through art - making mosaics, frescoes, and dioramas. There will be brief homework assignments given - never more than 20-30 minutes a week, which will allow us to cover as many cultures as possible!

Worldviews of the Western World-The Bible and Ancient Thought, Mrs. McCall (JD/HS) This course uses the work of theologian and philosopher, Francis Schaeffer as a scaffolding to compare a biblical worldview with non-Christian ways of seeing the world. Through in-depth study of the Bible, ancient Greek and Roman literature and philosophy, the work of St. Augustine and St. Thomas Aquinas, and Shaeffer's writing, students will be guided to see the

rational support for the truth of the Bible and the difficulty of understanding the world apart from God. Students will be asked to complete about 3 hours of reading and study outside of class each week, and four essays over the course of the year. The reward for all the hard work will be a foundational understanding of how Christian truth influences the wider world of thought and life.

This year-long afternoon class is the first year of a three-year series that progresses to study the thought of the Renaissance and Reformation, the Revolutionary age, and the Modern Age through the 21st century. However, each year can stand alone as a history/theology/philosophy/literature 3 credit class. You can read more about the curriculum here.

#### \*Notes:

- This class is a year-long course, so the tuition of \$300 reflects two semesters.
  The class will follow Deerstream's afternoon enrichment schedule, so classes will not meet in January or early February and will resume when spring enrichment classes start.
- Materials Required: This course requires the purchase of a student workbook at a cost of \$125 for the year. Some other books will be used, but these should be able to be acquired through the library and/or Deerstream purchase.
